Did you know: There are many sports available for students to participate in trials at a district level.

Most sports have a strict policy on the number of students each school can send to these trials. The Sports Coordinator **will nominate** the correct number of students to represent OPS at district level trials. Students are selected by way of extensive in-house trials.

The level of skill required to represent at district or regional level is very high and therefore the sports Coordinator may elect not to nominate student/s for trials.
